A message from our Senior Minister, Dr. George S. Dillard III

Go Fish

It's August and I'm thinking about going fishing. Fishing is a good place to be with the "dog days" of summer upon us. And fishing is a good place to do some thinking—some remembering. Recently I was reminded of a fishing trip a buddy and I took a few years ago—and a life lesson that came from that experience.



We had been given permission to fish in a lake that few fishermen had ever visited. Within minutes we caught a crappie and as all good fishermen know...where there is one crappie there are more! So, we dropped anchor and began to fish, steadily and with great success. Same spot—4 ½ to 5 hours. One of the things that we did not take into consideration was that this lake was a very old, Southeast Georgia lake with 5 to 6 feet of muck on the bottom. When it came time to go, our buckets full of crappie, I went to retrieve the anchor and couldn't budge it. My friend told me to quit "goofing off" because it was getting dark, so I offered to let him try. After a few minutes of his futile efforts, he suggested that we try together. With all of our might we pulled and tugged on the rope that held our boat to an anchor stuck in the mire. Our effort caused the back of the boat to tilt upward at a 45° angle and water began to lap over the front. We quickly realized that we were faced with limited options. We could either stay where we were, try to swim back fully dressed (neither of us were very good swimmers), or we could find a way to separate ourselves from what was keeping us from going home. We decided to cut the rope attached to the anchor that held us in place.

Now, as I reflect on that day some years later, I am reminded of the Scripture that says, "Let us then be freed from the sin that so easily entangles us" (Hebrew 12:1). There comes a time in most of our lives when we get stuck in a place that in the beginning seems good, but it is not. It's not the best place, it's not the place that we need to be, and it's certainly not home. But the longer we stay there the harder it becomes to free ourselves. In fact, it becomes impossible for us to get free, leaving us with only one thing we can do—cut the rope that binds us to the rebellion of sin and leave it at the foot of the cross. The only person capable of freeing us is Jesus Christ through the blood He shed on the cross. Without Him our options are limited. We can stay where we are, make a poor attempt using our own devices to find a way home, and continue to struggle futilely against a weight that is greater than we are, or we can turn to Jesus. The good news is because of God's grace, mercy, forgiveness and love, Jesus came into the world to free us from sin and allow us to leave it and all of our trespasses at the foot of His cross. I will never forget that fishing trip or its lessons, and I will never forget the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross—freeing me from sin's hold forever.

ON TOP of Serving



Robert and Natalie Braden, PTC³ missionary friends, along with their year-old son, Benjamin, flew in from Birmingham, England recently to combine GlobalScope business with a long-awaited family visit. After a very brief stop-over to leave Natalie and the baby in Atlanta, Robert and his "posse" of ten British students headed for northern Mexico and a week of hard work in the July heat.

Robert stopped in for iced coffee and a chat with our mission team members last week to fill us in on the successful week-long mission trip. Robert had escorted an unusual first-timers group of eleven—nine of whom are not Christians but are part of the growing campus ministry that Natalie and Robert head up in England. The group's mission was to build an addition to a house, which they did; Robert's goal was to build an even stronger relationship with these young adults. Judging by his animated smiles and the camaraderie exhibited in the photos of the project, he did. Many of the group stayed on until their college courses resume, enchanted by Georgia and the Coke Museum, a Braves game, and their favorite, the Stone Mountain Laser Show! Robert and Natalie will head north to Indiana for GlobalScopes' Annual Convention before collecting Benjamin and heading back to the challenges that await them in England. And challenges there are!

The Canvas site, an old church building they had rented and remodeled with hopes that this would be "home" to their campus ministry for a very long time, has been sold...their bid to purchase was not accepted. So the day before their flight to the States, paintbrushes in hand, the team began the glum task of erasing the bright, welcoming logos, the signs of upcoming events, Bible study times, dates for Saturday night suppers, coffee chats, and music fests—all the things that have made Canvas such a "smashing" success. But not to put too sad or melancholy face on it; even now the Bradens and their team are looking forward to what God has planned for the next phase in this remarkably successful outreach. On a regular Tuesday night, they

"talk about Jesus" to over 60 students. Since taking this unique challenge in 2005, they have built a long and warm relationship with many locals as well as with a number of exchange students from the States who come not once, but often twice to live and work beside this tireless missionary couple.

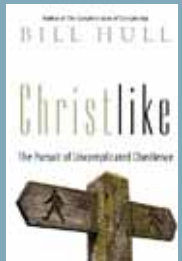

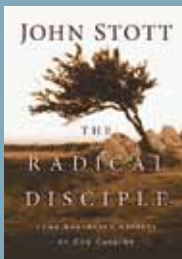

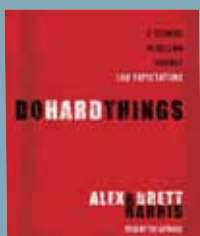

NEW CHOIR DIRECTOR



Cynthia Wilson has retired after teaching orchestra in the Georgia Public School system for 25 years. Our good fortune as she will become the new director of the choir program at PTC³. For the past three years she was the orchestra director at Bennett's Mill Middle School. For 7 years prior to coming to Fayette County, she was the orchestra director at Campbell High School (Cobb County), and before that, orchestra director at Sprayberry High School (Cobb County) for fifteen years. As music director, Ms. Wilson conducted the pit orchestra for "Music Man," "My Fair Lady," and "The Sound of Music." While at Campbell High School Ms. Wilson led the orchestra for "Little Shop of Horrors" and "West Side Story."

Ms. Wilson attended Belmont University and was a violinist with the Nashville Symphony. She later received the Bachelor of Music and Masters of Music from Columbus State University, and an Educational Specialist degree from West Georgia College. While in Nashville she worked at the Grand Ole Opry, performed with the Bee Gees, played backup on albums for various artists such as Elvis and Amy Grant, and toured briefly with the rock group Wild Cherry. Since returning to Georgia she has performed with Chet Atkins, Judy Collins, Lionel Hampton, Emmy Lou Harris, Barry White and Peter Nero. As a violinist, she performed with the Columbus Symphony, the Macon Symphony, the Cobb Symphony, the Dekalb Symphony, Southern Crescent Symphony and Orchestra Atlanta. She also sang with the Georgia Festival Singers under the direction of Frank Boggs and was honored to perform for the Queen of Denmark in 2002. Cynthia has been actively involved with and performed in churches from Nashville to Atlanta singing, conducting the choir, or playing in the orchestra. We are excited that such a talent will be directing and building our choir program.

Ms. Wilson resides in Tyrone with her mother, Mrs. Margie Wilson and with her "four-legged-daughter" Hannah, a precocious Schnauzer who rules the nest!


